# About the Killacourt

The Killacourt is an open public space in Newquay, located near the town centre and coastline. It is used for events, relaxation and as a route between different areas of town.

This guide provides images and information about access points and facilities to help you plan your visit.

# Entrances and Exits

There are four main access points to the Killacourt. These images show the layout, surfaces and gradients.



- Entrance from Trebarwith Crescent
- Surface: Paved
- Gradient: Sloped
- Notes: Widest access point

# Entrances and Exits



- Entrance from the bottom of The Crescent
- Surface: Paved
- Gradient: Mostly flat, with a very slight incline



# Entrances and Exits



- Entrance from the top of The Crescent
- Surface: Paved
- Gradient: Mostly flat, with a very slight incline
- Notes: Left of pavement edge is flush, with a slight lip to the right side

# Entrances and Exits



- Entrance from Island Crescent
- Surface: Paved
- Gradient: Gentle slope

# Pathways Through the Killacourt

The main route through the Killacourt is a wide resin pathway, connected by paved footways.

This provides a smoother surface for wheelchairs, mobility scooters and prams.

It runs through the centre of the space and follows a sloped gradient.





# Seating

Seating is available throughout the Killacourt. This provides places to rest, meet others or take a break while moving through the space.



- Fixed seating located around the space
- Positioned along main routes
- These benches do not have backrests or armrests



# Seating



- Fixed seating located around the space
- Positioned at the bottom of the Killacourt overlooking the beach
- These benches have backrests and armrests

# Seating



- Fixed seating in an amphitheatre style
- Positioned at the Bandstand
- There is level access to this area from the Island Crescent entrance



# Access to the Retail Quarter

The Killacourt has its own Retail Quarter and all units have step free access.



- Entrance to the Retail Quarter
- Surface: Resin pathway
- Gradient: Sloped



# Toilets

Public toilets are available at Trebarwith Crescent.



Opening times:

- October–March: 10am–4pm
- April–September: 9am–6pm

There is a 50p charge and facilities include:

- Ladies (5 cubicles, baby change)
- Gents (4 urinals, 2 cubicles)
- 1 accessible toilet

# Changing Places Facility

There is a Changing Places facility on the Killacourt, which is free for registered users.



Opening times:

- October–March: 10am–4pm
- April–September: 9am–6pm
- Closed on Sundays and public holidays

# Changing Places Facility

## Features:

- Bench – Height Adjustable, Adult Sized, Wall Mounted
- Hoist – Ceiling , Loop
- Peninsular Toilet
- Washbasin Height Adjustable
- Slip Resistant Floor
- Floor Space (sq. m) – 11.0
- Emergency Alarm
- Privacy Screen
- Paper Roll
- Accessible Shower
- Colostomy Shelf
- Unisex
- Signage in the room
- Drop down grab rails
- Wall grab rails
- Large Bin
- Door Width (m) – 1.00
- Ceiling height (m) – 2.40





# Parking

There are several town centre car parks in walking distance of the Killacourt:

- Manor Car Park (long stay) – 4 minute walk
- St George's Rd (long stay) – 7 minute walk
- Mount Wise (long stay) – 7 minute walk
- Fore Street (short stay) – 7 minute walk

All blue badge holders must display a valid blue badge with time clock set at time of arrival.

Blue badge holders must pay the normal parking fee unless the vehicle is registered under Cornwall Council's exemption scheme or adapted vehicle scheme.

Street parking:

- Limited parking areas – for an unlimited time
  - Yellow lines – for 3 hours or less. Unless notices or signs say otherwise.
  - Resident parking zones – for 3 hours or less
  - Disabled bays – for an unlimited time unless roadside signs show time limits
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# Things to Consider Before You Visit

- The space is open and exposed to weather
- Surfaces vary between paved, resin and grass
- The area can be busy during events
- There is open access to Towan Beach directly from the Killacourt
