Wheelchair Hire

Visit Newquay Tourist Information Centre hires out four wheelchairs. Three are of of the same type. Standard sized, lightweight, collapsible wheelchairs which have the small pneumatic tyres that cannot be reached or turned by the user. The fourth wheelchair, is a standard size but has large wheels with solid tyres that can be turned by the user (we would advise gloves or hand protection) The wheelchairs are available on a first come, first served basis but can be pre-booked. We would recommend booking in advance as there is high demand at certain times of the year.

We charge £7.00 per day or £35.00 per week (cash or card) and also require a £50.00 cash deposit (cash only). The deposit is returned in full upon return of the Wheelchair.

Wheelchairs are can only be collected and returned at the Visit Newquay Tourist Information Centre during normal opening hours. Please call to check opening.

Summer: Mon - Fri: 9.00am to 5.30pm, Sat/Sun & Bank holidays 10.00am to 4.00pm.

Winter: Mon - Fri: 10.00am to 4.00pm, Sat/Sun & Bank holidays 10.00am to 3.00pm.

Wheelchair max weight: 100 kgs (15 \% stone)

We do not have larger ones, or children's wheelchairs but Independent Living below should.

Mobility Scooters, Powered & Special Wheelchairs + other equipment

Cornwall Council - Car Park Guidelines

PLEASE NOTE: Not all public car parks in Newquay and Cornwall are run by Cornwall Council and therefore these rules will not apply. Cornwall Council are changing most of it's car parks from 'Pay and Display' to 'Pay on Exit'.

Rules for parking in Council car parks. Blue badge holders must pay the normal parking fee unless:

- The vehicle is registered under Cornwall Council's exemption scheme (Pre-arrangement required as the car registration number is required)
- The vehicle is especially adapted for a disabled person

You must display a valid blue badge with the clock showing when you arrived, whether you have to pay for parking or not. If you don't correctly display your badge and clock, you may receive a penalty charge notice.

Blue badge holders paying a parking fee automatically get one extra hour of free parking in Pay & Display Car Parks (Not Pay on Exit). For example, if you correctly display a blue badge and pay for 2 hours, you can park for 3 hours. This additional hour will not apply in Pay On Exit car parks.

You can park up to the maximum stay shown on the signs in the car park.

If no disabled spaces are available, you can park in a normal space as long as it's not marked for other uses, such as reserved parking or loading areas.

Display the blue badge on your dashboard or fascia panel so it can be clearly read through the windscreen. The front of the badge should face upwards, showing the hologram. You must display your clock with your badge when you park on yellow lines or in a disabled space with a time limit. Set the clock to show when you arrived and put it next to your blue badge on the dashboard or fascia panel. If you don't correctly display your badge and clock, you may receive a penalty charge notice.

Blue badge in private car parks. It's up to the car park owner to decide whether you can park for free or not. Check the signs in the car park.

Cornwall Council - Street Car Parking Guidelines

National Blue Badge Scheme

The national blue badge scheme provides parking concessions for people with certain disabilities. A blue badge lets you park closer to the shops and services you need to use, whether you're the driver or a passenger in a car.

The blue badge is for on-street parking. There are different rules for off-street parking, like council, hospital or supermarket car parks.

The blue badge is currently recognised in all European countries. It allows you the same parking concessions as residents of the country you are visiting. There has been no information as yet to whether this will continue following the UK leaving the European Union.

Rules for street parking.

If you display your blue badge correctly and your vehicle isn't causing an obstruction, you can park in or on:

- Limited parking areas for an unlimited time
- Yellow lines for 3 hours or less. Unless notices or signs say otherwise.
- Resident parking zones for 3 hours or less
- Disabled bays for an unlimited time unless roadside signs show time limits

Blue badge holders can't park in:

- An area where there is a loading restriction
- An area specifically reserved for other vehicles or purposes, such as taxi ranks, reserved spaces in car parks, bus stops or loading bays and marked cycle paths.
- Any area restricting access, such as access for a private ambulance.

European Union disabled parking badge in Cornwall.

You now may have to make special arrangements to use them in Cornwall. Please contact **Cornwall Council** for more information.

Non European Union disabled parking badge in Cornwall.

If you want to use a disabled parking badge from a country outside the European Union, Cornwall Council will need some information from you before you arrive in Cornwall. This will help ensure you don't receive a penalty charge notice. Please contact Cornwall Council for more information.

- A copy of the disabled parking badge you will be using
- Your vehicle registration number (we understand you might not be able to tell us this if you're hiring a car)
- Dates of your stay in Cornwall
- A general idea of where you'll be in Cornwall (for example, Padstow or Truro) you don't have to provide exact locations or a daily travel plan
- When you visit Cornwall, you'll have the same rights and responsibilities as people with UK disabled parking badges.

Beach Access - Part 1

Newquay has many sandy beaches with differing levels of access. The following is intended as a guide. In many cases beaches can be accessed on the sand from the adjacent beach. However, most beaches are cut off from adjacent beaches at high tide (or even partial high tide) so please be aware of the tide times. Tide Timetables are available at Newquay Tourist Information Centre. Please note this information is for guidance only.

Beach Wheelchairs

- Fistral Beach has Newquay's only beach wheel chair. Please contact them first on 01637 850584 for information and availability.
- Currently the beach wheelchair service on the central Towan Beach is not running.
- There is also no Watergate Bay beach wheelchair contrary to some publications.

Fistral Beach. (% mile / 1 km from town centre)

One of Newquay's main surfing beaches. Bordered by dunes, with limited access from the Fistral Beach Complex. Beach wheelchair available - please see above.

Parking: Private car park within 50 Metres (55 yards)

Dogs: All dogs allowed, all year

Bus: No nearby bus stop

Cafe: Within 50 Metres (55 yards)

Newquay Harbour Beach (Central Newquay)

Newquay Harbour and beach is surrounded by cliffs, with a very steep roadway and steps down to the beach and harbour. The steep roadway can be difficult for those in wheelchairs and those with limited mobility. The steep slope is also unsuitable for some low powered Mobility Scooters. There is some parking available, including 2 disabled places. No beach wheelchairs are available.

Parking: 2 disabled parking spaces normally available

Dogs: All dogs allowed, all year

Bus: No nearby bus stop

Café/Restaurant: By the beach.

Towan Beach (Central Newquay)

Our town centre beach, with a fairly shallow roadway slope down to the beach.

Parking: Nearest car park is the town Car Park, Manor road.

Dogs: All dogs allowed, all year

Bus: No nearby bus stop

Café/Restaurant: By the beach.

Great Western Beach (Central Newquay)

Close to the town centre, with a steep roadway slope down. No steps

Parking: Private Parking

Dogs: All dogs allowed, all year

Bus: Bus stop with 50 metres at the top of the cliffs

Café/Restaurant: By the beach

MORE BEACHES >

Beach Access - Part 2

Tolcarne Beach (Central Newquay)

A central beach, surrounded by steep cliffs. Steep roadway & steep steps access.

Parking: Private parking (rules apply) next to beach

Dogs: Dog ban Easter to Oct. Guide dogs, Hearing dogs and other assistance dogs allowed

Bus: At the top of the cliffs Cafe: Next to the Beach

Lusty Glaze Beach. (% mile / 1 Km from town centre)

Lusty Glaze beach is a privately owned beach and is currently closed to the public except for booked events.

Parking: At the top of the cliffs

Dogs: Dogs on leads all year. Guide dogs, Hearing dogs and other assistance dogs allowed

Bus: No nearby bus stop Cafe: Next to the Beach

Porth Beach. (2 miles / 3 km from Newquay) with a Car park on the beach

Another large, expansive beach without cliffs on the road side. There is a car park actually on the beach at the South end and there is a larger car park over the road at the other end of the beach.

Parking: On the beach at the end of Porth Beach Road or over the road from the beach

Dogs: Daytime Dog Ban Easter to Oct. Guide dogs, Hearing dogs and other assistance dogs allowed

Bus: Bus stop at North end but not South end where the beach parking is.

Cafe: Within 50 Metres (55 yards)

Whipsiderry Beach has no access in 2024

Watergate Bay. (4 miles / 6 km from Newquay)

A very long beach with good access via the Beach Complex near the centre. The beach has fairly steep cliffs at each end.

Parking: Next to Beach

Dogs: Dogs allowed all year

Bus: At the top of cliff

Cafe: Within 50 Metres (55 yards)

Crantock. (2.5 miles/ 4km from Newquay)

Another large, expansive, beach 2.5 miles (4Km) from Newquay town centre. It has a small car park with the main access to beach over a steep sand dune, therefore, no access for wheelchairs and poor mobility access.

Parking: Within 50 Metres (55 yards)

Dogs: Dogs allowed all year Bus: No nearby bus stop

Cafe: Within 200 Metres (300 yards)

Please note: Information on the level of access of our beaches is subjective and is for guidance only. Private businesses opening times and availability are subject to change without notice. Restrictions due to rock falls, tides, weather conditions etc may change the level of access. Bus stops are no guarantee of an operating bus service (particularly during the Winter). Please check bus details.

Blue Reef Aquarium.

Towan Promenade, Newquay, Cornwall. TR7 1DU

The Blue reef Aquarium is located at the base of cliffs at Towan Beach. From the main town centre there are steeps steps, so wheelchair/scooter access is by the roadway.

The attraction is almost entirely accessible with a ramped entrance and a lift to the first floor displays. The nursery tank area, consisting of 6 small tanks, is not accessible due to some steps. However, this is very small part of the entire aquarium attraction.

Newquay Zoo

The Zoo is almost entirely wheelchair accessible. Only a raised viewing area, overlooking the Lynx enclosure is up some steps so is not accessible. Newquay Zoo is part of the accessible Trenance Leisure Park. This is about 20 minutes walk from the town centre. It is in a slight valley so roads down to it can be quite steep. It is accessible by an open sided 'road train which has some wheelchair accessibility. The 'Road Train' runs on the hour, from the town centre. There is a Council Car Park nearby.

Trenance Leisure Park, Gardens & Boating Lake

Trenance Leisure Park consists of extensive gardens, a boating lake, child's play area, Pitch & Putt, Miniature railway, bowling, the Heron Tennis Centre and the Waterworld Water Park. The area has tarmac paths and is mostly entirely on the flat.
