Newquay is known as a prime surfing destination, however, there is a whole host of other activities that will provide an adrenaline boost for thrill seekers...

There are also areas to practice where you can head out into the waves and get involved with the surfing community by hiring your equipment.

2024 UPDATE

In early 2024, Phase 2 construction of the concrete skatepark should have started, featuring a new junior section, tailor-made for diverse skaters of all ages and skill levels, including the younger, older, and less experienced, addressing the need for additional space. This expansion caters to skaters of all ages and skill levels, enhancing accessibility. Funding comes from Cornwall Council's Community Infrastructure Levy, Newquay Town Council, and the Boardmasters Foundation.



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

Dock of the Bay

The beating heart of the town for generations, the harbour is where the name Newquay originates. We raise some secrets from its depths as well as reveal some exciting things to do in this area...

Newquay was first mentioned in the early 15th century as "a keye" a small fishing hamlet on the edge of the manor of Towan Blystra. The apparent damage to the

existing quay in 1439 led to a request for assistance from Edmund Lacy, Bishop of Exeter. An indulgence was granted to all those who contributed to the rebuilding work by way of labour, materials or money.

Newquay was further mentioned by Richard Carew in his Survey of Cornwall of 1603 as "newe Kaye" a place only suited for fishing. During the early 19th century the growing village of New Quay was joined to the village of Towan by Fore

Street to become the small town of Newquay as renamed by the Chamber of Commerce in 1882. This period saw the gradual evolution of the town from fishing and a coastal marine harbour town to a growing tourist destination.

With the coming of the passenger railway to Newquay in 1876 and the subsequent





increase in tourism during the 20th century, the traditional harbour based industries declined. However recent developments have seen Newquay Harbour develop to support the tourist trade with charter boats providing deep-sea fishing for anglers and fishing boats supplying fish and shellfish to local restaurants.

Sea Safaris

For those with a passion for wildlife, a Sea Safari is a must when visiting Newquay. Boats sail out from the harbour every day, exploring the north coast, discovering hidden coves spotting seals and even dolphins and sharks!

FISHING

Many fishing trips set sail from the harbour to give visitors the experience of deep-sea fishing. Catch your dinner with Fish Newquay and have the satisfaction of bringing it ashore to cook for your family that evening

Sailing

For all things boating, the harbour is THE place to be! Many sailing boats head out to sea each day (weather and tide permitting) between May and September giving you a fascinating perspective of Newquay and its surroundings.

BEACHY BITE

The Boathouse is a relaxed street food market and bar located on the beach. They are home to a gathering of local street food traders serving up fresh Cornish seafood and a varied selection of global fare. The coastal path follows the cliffs which border most of the Newquay beaches, so you can choose to either walk the paths or on the beach. When walking on the beaches, special care must be taken to know your tide times. Most of Newquay's beaches have steps or roadways down to them but some sections in between

the main beaches can be cut off by the tide - even when it is only part-way in.

The coastal path follows the cliffs and walking north of Newquay you can walk virtually uninterrupted to Padstow and beyond, passing through typical Cornish villages on your way. The coastal road between Newquay and Padstow follows the coast path fairly closely so it is a popular option to use the bus service as a way of returning or vice-versa.

Unlock the secrets of Newquay's past with the Newquay Discovery Trail Map.

Recently revised and reprinted the map has been updated with newly discovered information and additional artwork. This beautifully illustrated map is both a great guide to the two enjoyable and informative walks around the town and also a great keepsake for your visit.

The map features the two walks, 'Hetty' and 'Ada' that make up the entire Discovery

the map, follows a mostly coastal route including the beautiful Harbour, the 'House on the Island' and Fistral Beach.

The 'Ada', pink on the map, takes in some of the coasts but then moves inland passing through the Trenance Valley, Gardens & Boating Lake and near popular Newquay attractions including the Zoo, Newquay Leisure World and the Heron Tennis Centre.

Walking the Newquay Discovery Trails you will find slate discs, about a metre (1 yard) in diameter, embedded in the ground at key places of interest. Each slate circle is numbered and these link in with

the map with fascinating facts about your location, whilst taking in some spectacular views – a great way to enjoy a tour of Newquay without a car.

History of *Newquay*



LIFEBOATS

The sea made Newquay what it is but whilst it may give plenty, it can take away. Many a poor soul has succumbed to its ocean waters but Newquay has a long history with the first point of rescue – the lifeboat. Developed from privately owned rowboats and pilot gigs of merciful individuals into the RNLI craft launched from Towan Head's Old Lifeboat Station, and now from the Harbour itself.

Huer's Hut

One man. The Huer. One little cliff-top dwelling and their sole aim was to spot shoals of pilchards swimming into Newquay Bay. He would announce their arrival with a bellowing Huer's horn (over 3ft, about 1 metre long) whilst calling out *Hovval Hevval*. The fishermen on land would race to launch their fishing boats. Once salted and packed, these little fish were in demand for their long 'shelf' life and a mainstay of the Newquay, and Cornish economy for centuries.





Town Blystra

Towan Blystra was just one area of what would become modern Newquay. The Harbour was part of the Towan Blystra Manor Estate bordered by several other Manor Estates. After extensive development by local benefactors, the harbour area became colloquially known as New Keye (New Quay/Newquay). It was widely regarded as no longer the responsibility of the Towan Blystra Manor Estate.

Mining

Newquay wasn't known for tin mines but for lead and some silver. Lehenver Mine was operated from 1860 on Mount Wise but closed and the shaft was then used as a source of water. The water treatment plant was demolished by the early 20th Century.

Around the same time, there were also the Treloggan, Morganna (St Columb Minor/Porth), Tolcarne (Wheal Narrow) and Fistral (Consols) lead mines. The Cathedral Cavern in Porth Island was a source of lead ore.

HOUSE ON THE ISLAND

The House on the Island. Jago's island. Originally home to just a potato patch and hen house the only access was a now disused steep path. Towan Blystra Manor Estate sold it in 1898. The new owners built a summer house and footbridge by 1905. Sold in 1906 and then used as a seasonal tearoom. Then sold again and the new owner built a permanent dwelling by 1910. Residents have included an inventor and a Lord but it is now holiday accommodation.

Serving up a slice of Old Newquay, Trenance Cottages, a trio of beautifully renovated, Grade II listed, Cornish cottages are open to the public and free to enter – the only such row of pre-railway age dwellings found in Cornwall!

Situated in the heart of the tranquil and award-winning Trenance Gardens, Trenance Cottages have been lovingly preserved, protected, and improved by a group of volunteers who have saved a piece of history to create a

short walk from the River Gannel and the Rose Garden, this quaint trio of cottages offers a detailed insight into Newquay's heritage.

Built on the site of an old malthouse, the dwellings now offer a unique attraction where visitors can learn, relax, and unwind in an iconic setting away from the hustle and bustle of the beaches and town centre. Exploring the homesteads of Vine, Middle, and Rose Cottages, one is invited to step back in time to experience the way Cornish ancestors once lived. From the lives of a lifeboat

coxswain to an evacuee, the museum contains a splendid collection of artifacts and information about the lives of past inhabitants and explores their family heritage.

The museum also allows visitors to listen

to recordings from Newquay residents, view artifacts from the 1900s, learn about the buildings' history and play a beautifully restored pianola!

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



Scenic Train Journeys



Newquay station is conveniently located in the heart of the town, making it a great starting point for scenic rail journeys across Cornwall.

Departing from Newquay, the train crosses Goss Moor and onwards through the beautiful Luxulyan Valley. Get off at

Luxulyan station to explore the wooded valley and its mining heritage, or to enjoy a walk to the Eden Project (3 miles).

The Newquay branch line brings you to Par station on the Cornish main line. Change here and head west to visit St Ives, Truro or Falmouth, or east to Looe, Plymouth or on into Devon. Particular highlights include:

Plymouth

Visit the city's historic waterfront. On the Hoe, admire the iconic Smeaton's Tower lighthouse and imagine Francis Drake taking in the same views of Plymouth Sound as he looked out on the Armada. Looe Valley line

The branch line to Looe is full of beautiful views out of the train window. The wooded valley teeming with wildlife opens up to glorious estuary views as the river meets the sea. Bird watchers will love this line as, especially at low tide, the river is full of wading birds such as Little Egrets, Grey Herons, Oystercatchers and Curlews. Once in Looe, there's plenty to explore from the harbour to the safe beaches, the excellent restaurants to the maze of narrow streets full of lovely independent shops and pubs.
